## ACT Experience: Worth Every Penny!

Patricia H. is one of our new wheelchair clients who found us through the Visiting Nurses Association of Hanover & Spring Grove. She has regular medical appointments that are less than 3 miles from her house, and she was paying \$150 for a 4-mile round trip wheelchair transport. Due to generous donations from community members and volunteer drivers, we are able to discount our transport fees for individuals who must pay out of pocket and have limited financial resources. Pat now only pays \$50 for

that same round trip provided by Accessible Care Transport, and her daughter is able to ride with her to her appointment at no extra charge. She loves how she is treated by our driver Ed, who handles her with care and dignity, and has decided to use ACT as her dedicated transport service.

We are so happy that we are able to help Pat get to her much needed recurring medical treatment, and at a much more affordable price. But we need your help to keep our prices down for individuals like Pat, especially as prices increase for gas, insurance and vehicle upkeep.
